To our families and friends,

On Tuesday, the whole school took part in this year's Safer Internet Day and all classes had an age appropriate lesson with their teacher. As a school, we teach a safer internet lesson at the beginning of every half term, in all classes, so that these important safety messages are being revisited, consolidated and built upon. The theme for this year was 'Inspiring change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online'. Earlier in the week, we sent an email with some guidance how to support your child to stay safe online especially in a world where so much technology is available for children to use. We hope that you have received this email and had a chance to look at how you can help to ensure that your child is staying safe online.

On Wednesday, we had an external advisor from Herts for Learning come into school to review our art curriculum. She was very impressed with the quality of the children's art work in their books and how their artistic skills are developing year on year.

This week, we have been especially proud of our Year 6 class who have taken part in their mock SAT's before they sit their end of KS2 SAT's in May. The children have been amazing and approached their mock tests with such positivity and enthusiasm.

On Wednesday afternoon, Year 6 and some children in Year 5 went to Wodson Park for a Sportshall competition against other local schools. We were thrilled that our boys team came first overall and our girls team came third overall. All of the children returned to school with their medals and were extremely proud of their achievements. Next week is the last week of this half term and we have lots taking place across the school. On Tuesday, we are looking forward to welcoming the Bubble Theatre Company for a Great Fire of London workshop with Year 2. They have been learning about this historical event this half term, so it will be a fantastic finish to their topic.

Mini Progress Reports

Today, you will have received your child's mini progress report. These will have been sent home with your child today, so please check their reading bags if you haven't seen this yet.

The teachers have reviewed the progress that your child has made towards the targets that were set in the autumn term for the core subjects as well as setting new targets to work towards achieving over the next few months. These targets and the progress your child has made to date will be discussed at the parent/teacher meetings on 13th and 15th February but we like you to have the paper copy in advance to read. French Learning App

Does your child love learning languages? In school, all children in KS2 (and from Year 2 in the summer term) have weekly French lessons. The teachers use a scheme called 'Language Angels' to support the delivery of lessons and there is now a Language Angels app available with lots of interactive games and karaoke videos which is completely free and available to all pupils.

You will find the app by visiting the Apple App Store from any Apple device and searching for 'Language Angels'. Look out for our angel character in the app icon so they know they're downloading the correct app. We have created a simple login which all your pupils can use to access and use the app.

The username and password are case sensitive. The app is completely safe for your pupils to use and there is no way for children to be able to contact or interact with anyone else on the app.
