To our parents and friends,

I hope that you and your children had an enjoyable Easter time and got to make some lovely new memories and enjoy the time together.

In the newsletter published before we broke up for the Easter holiday, we included information regarding the summer term after school club enrichment opportunities. The Gateway (to sign your child up for some of the after school clubs) went live during the Easter holiday. It is currently still open and there are still places available on some clubs including school magazine club, choir, book club and times table club. As always, we also have some after school clubs run by external club providers and for most of these clubs you will need to sign your child up via the information that we have sent home prior to the Easter holiday. From this term, we are also requesting that children no longer bring snacks along to eat in the clubs after school. We have been monitoring this for some time now and the general consensus from the staff who run the clubs is that the snacks causes several issues. Whilst eating a snack (which do vary considerably in size), children aren't able to join in with many of the clubs which means that some activities can't start until children have finished eating. We are still happy for children to have access to their water bottles during the clubs.

This week, I have met with the class teachers and teaching assistants to discuss the progress and attainment made by the children in the spring term. These meetings are always very professional and I'm always so impressed by the knowledge that the teachers and teaching assistants have about each and every child. During these meetings we specifically looked at the progress and attainment of the children in reading, writing and maths and plan interventions for those children who would benefit from some additional support. Teachers will be sending home the intervention letters by the end of next week.

Sponsored Bounce

Before the Easter holiday, all the children took part in our annual sponsored bounce fundraiser. This is a major fundraiser that we organise and the money raised this year is going to be used to purchase more laptops to extend our current range as well as to replace some of our older models. Please can we ask that all promised sponsorship money now be brought into school and handed to the class teacher or paid directly to the school via the Gateway. Like last year, we will be awarding prizes to the child in each phase across the school who individually raises the most money and a certificate for all of the children who bring in their sponsorship money, no matter how much this may be - every £ will make a big difference. We would really appreciate all the sponsorship money being sent in by the end of this month so that we can get more laptops into school as soon as possible. Thank you so much for your support.

Tesco Stronger Start Grant

We have recently applied for Tesco's Stronger Start Grant Award in order to further develop the outdoor areas in the early years. We were thrilled to find out that we have been successful in our application and during April, May and June, Tesco customers will be able to vote in store.
